## The "Corrupt Bargain"

- In the House, each state would get one \_\_\_\_\_ for president
- Clay encouraged states to vote for Adams
  - Considered Jackson a "military chieftan"
- A few days after the House elects Adams, Clay becomes \_\_\_\_\_
  - He hopes to be the next president
- Jacksonian's cry a "Corrupt Bargain"
- This haunts Clay and Adams for the rest of their careers
