 - Reagan Coalition:
 - Southern whites also supported Reagan - Nixon's " _____ "
 - Moral Majority:
 - Religious Right group led by Jerry Falwell
 - Reagan Democrats:
 - Many _____-collar workers that became weary of protests and welfare spending
- Conservatives in Power
- Reaganomics:
 - Supply-side economics - advocated _____ taxes and investing in businesses to improve the economy
 - Economic Recovery Tax Act:
 - Large tax cut
 - Social Security and Medicare remained in tact - powerful _____ block
 - The national debt increased under Reagan - increased _____ spending
- Deregulation
 - Decrease in government regulation (connect to President _____)
 - Led to lower spending by government
 - At the end of his presidency, the size of the government remained virtually _____
- Remaking the Judiciary:
 - _____ - first female justice
 - Under the Rehnquist court (1986 - 2005), the Supreme Court did not make drastic changes in either direction
- HIV/AIDS:

 - US sold weapons to Iran and sent \$ to the Contras of Nicaragua
 - Goal was to overthrow the Sandinista government

- Gorbachev and Soviet Reform
