### Becoming African-American

### British Patriotism

- Impacts of conflicts with European countries (France?)

### The British Constitution

### Republican Liberty

### Political Cultures

### Imperial Rivalries

#### Spanish North America

- Controlled Mexico, SW US, Great Plains, LA Purchase after \_\_\_\_\_

- Many *presidios* were established in CA
- Many natives died after Spain settled

- Present-day Canada and Mississippi River Valley

### Battle For The Continent

#### The Middle Ground

- \_\_\_\_\_ became very important for England, France, and Natives alike
- Natives such as the Iroquois played Europeans off of each other
- Ohio Company sought land recognition from France and ignited the 7 Years' War

#### The Seven Years' War

- Initially, the French and Natives were successful, later the British prevailed

#### A World Transformed

- Peace of Paris (1763)
  - France lost Canada to Britain, Spain lost Florida to Britain

#### Pontiac's Rebellion

- Natives in MI, OH, IN revolted against the encroachment of British colonists
