### Slavery in the Constitution

- Fugitive Slave clause - a slaves would remain slaves, even if they \_\_\_\_\_ to a free state
- National government could not interfere with slavery in states
- Most early presidents owned slaves (Washington, Jefferson, Madison, etc.)

### The Final Document

- \_\_\_\_\_ helped persuade delegates to ratify the document
- National economy was strengthened due to Congressional powers:
  - Interstate trade, tariffs, coining money, etc.

## The Ratification Debate And The Origin Of The Bill Of Rights

### The Federalist

- Also known as The Federalist Papers
- \_\_\_\_\_ essays (Hamilton, Madison, Jay), urged \_\_\_\_\_ of the Constitution
- Hamilton argued the Constitution protected individual liberties, did not limit them

### “Extend The Sphere”

- Federalist #10 and #51 (video in description)
  - Argued for separation of powers and benefits of a large republic, controlling factions (\_\_\_\_\_)
- The more diverse the country became, the more liberties people had

### The Anti-Federalists

- Key figures such as \_\_\_\_\_
- \_\_\_\_\_ were weary of a strong central government
- Biggest argument was a lack of \_\_\_\_\_
- Madison promised a Bill of Rights would be added after the Constitution was ratified

### The Bill of Rights

- State Constitutions had their own Bill of Rights
- Some Amendments:
  - 1 - Freedom of speech, press, religion, assembly, petition
  - 2 - bear arms
  - 4 - \_\_\_\_\_ needed to search a home
  - 5 - No double jeopardy, can't be forced to testify against oneself
  - 9 - Rights not listed can't be \_\_\_\_\_ away
  - 10 - powers given to states (\_\_\_\_\_)
    - Education, licensing professionals, etc.
- Until the 20th century, the Bill of Rights ONLY applied to the \_\_\_\_\_ government, NOT states (More in AP Gov)
- No mention of God in the Constitution

## We The People

### National Identity

- Preamble references liberty, posterity (later echoed by \_\_\_\_\_ in the Civil War)
- Indians were not considered Americans
- No mention of \_\_\_\_\_, referred to as “other persons”
- \_\_\_\_\_ Indians in the New Nation
- Westward expansion led to debates over treatment of Natives
